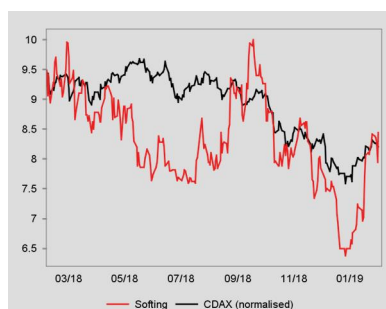
Preliminary Q4 figures reflect a record revenue level

- Softing has released key 2018 figures. Revenues of EUR 84m reflected growth of 7% and marked a new record level. Q4 growth was even more dynamic reaching 16%. Despite start-up costs of approx. EUR 1m for Globalmatix, which became part of the group in 2018, EBIT nearly doubled to EUR 4.1m.

- The **Automotive** segment, which was loss-making in 2017, achieved profitability. The transition of its software products to subscription-based revenues is complete. As Softing's products in this segment address R&D departments, after-sales and production infrastructure, short and medium-term production cuts in the automotive sector have no direct impact on Softing's business. Globalmatix provides the opportunity to further boost the business. Along with typical telematics with geo data, driving behaviour, etc., Globalmatix is the only provider to offer online CAN diagnostic data (i.e. vehicle data) for mixed fleets.
- In **IT Networks**, the focus in 2018 was on strong growth, which obviously contributed a strong overall top-line performance. In 2019, the focus will be on margin improvement. For this purpose, Softing is replacing low-margin distribution business with higher-margin proprietary products. These new products were presented to the market at the end of 2018 and will gain a higher revenue share in the current year.
- In **Industrial Automation** Softing started the new year with solid direct sales to major customers in the oil & gas sector with a very good order backlog which contributed to a comfortable overall group order book. In 2019, management expects growing revenues and further EBIT growth. The company will issue an initial guidance with the publication of its 2018 annual report which will be released on March 29. As in previous years, the revenue distribution during the course of the year should reflect a higher revenue share in H2 vs. H1.
- While there is already attractive upside to our PT, the Hold rating is being confirmed as our 2019 EBIT estimate anticipates noteworthy Globalmatix revenue contributions which should be accompanied by high incremental margins. However, the business is in a ramp-up phase with promising tests still ongoing.

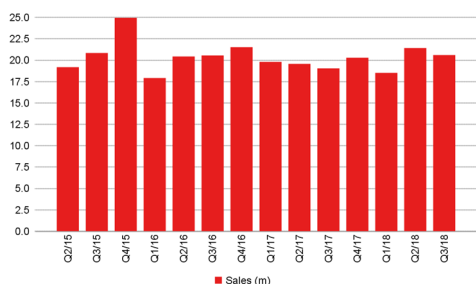

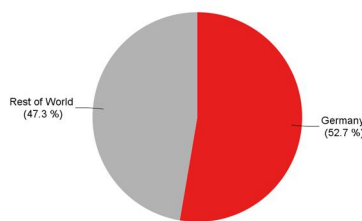

in EUR m



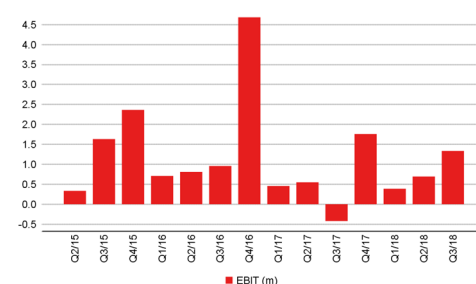

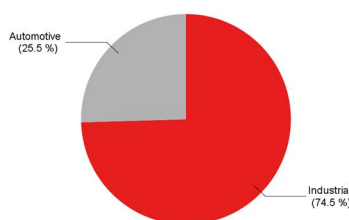
Company Background

- Softing has the necessary expertise on information exchange between various devices, sensors, plant and software solutions in automated processes. The business activity comprises two segments.
- Industrial Automation: hardware and software solutions for the exchange of information in all kinds of production including montage lines, chemical plants, oil and gas extraction or refineries.
- The subsidiary IT Networks is part of the Industrial Automation segment. Its solutions are used to test complex IT networks in industrial automation, office installations and data centers.
- Automotive Electronics: The solutions allow engineers and workshop mechanics to test automotive electronics in the development phase, production or repair and to recognise errors through data evaluation.
- The solutions in the automotive segment are not for application within the vehicles and therefore do not pose a product re-call risk for the company.

Competitive Quality

- European market leader in the networking of various production plant elements as well as in business-related software (so-called OPC products).
- World market leader in components for the exchange of information in gas and oil plants. Some >50% of all devices registered worldwide that are used in these plants include components from Softing.
- Through participation in international committees that set standards for the exchange of information, a short time-to-market is achieved.
- The high complexity of Softing's business activity is the single most important barrier to market entry for potential competitors.

Free Cash Flow Value Potential

Warburg Research's valuation tool "FCF Value Potential" reflects the ability of the company to generate sustainable free cash flows. It is based on the "FCF potential" - a FCF "ex growth" figure - which assumes unchanged working capital and pure maintenance capex. A value indication is derived via the perpetuity of a given year's FCF potential with consideration of the weighted costs of capital. The fluctuating value indications over time add a timing element to the DCF model (our preferred valuation tool).

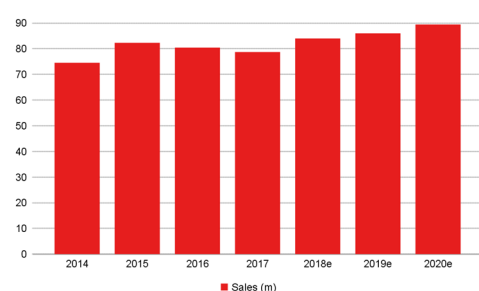

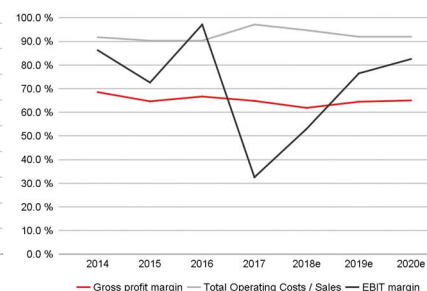
Sales, EBITDA

in EUR m

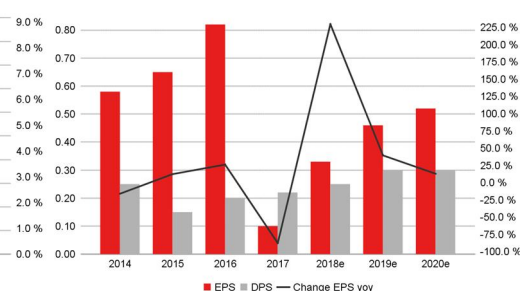


Operating Performance

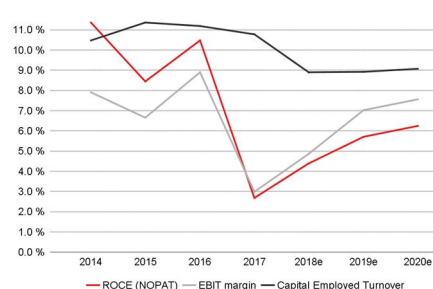

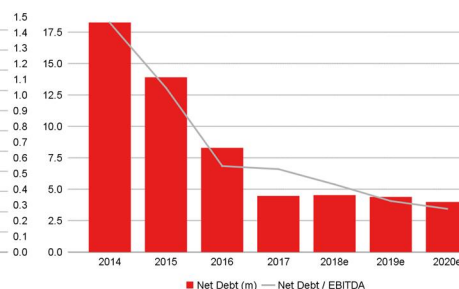

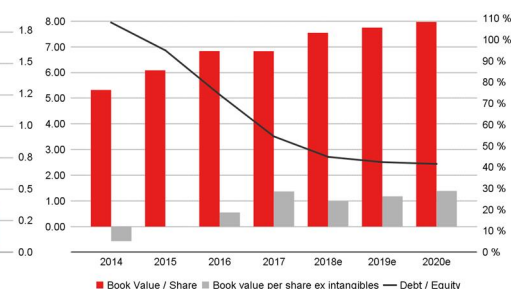
ROCE Development

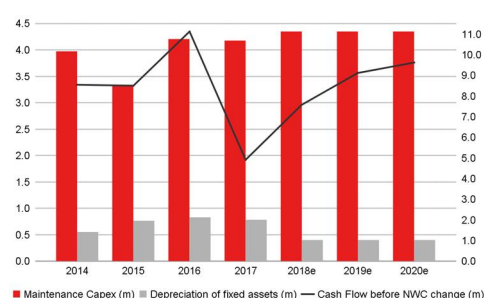

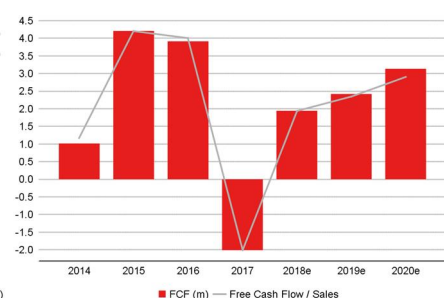

CAPEX and Cash Flow in EUR m



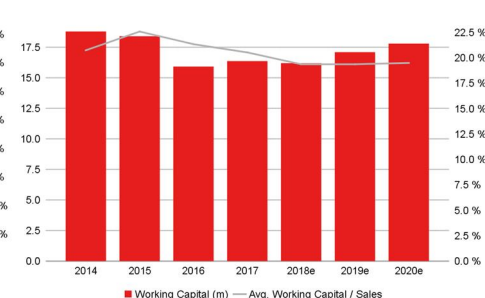

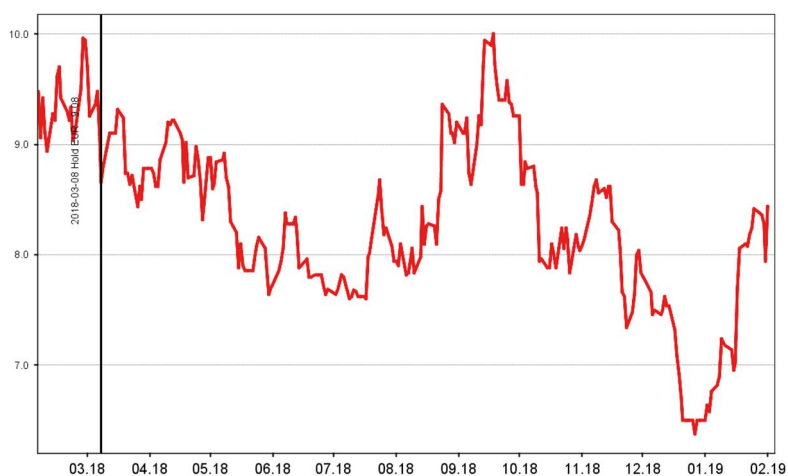
